The Season of Creation (1st Sept – 4th Oct)

"In the Judaeo-Christian tradition, the word "creation" has a broader meaning than "nature"... Nature is usually seen as a system which can be studied, understood and controlled, whereas creation can only be understood as a gift from the outstretched hand of the Father of all." (LS 76)

Water is a symbol of regeneration because it is the drink we constantly need; it cleanses and constantly restores life. It may be abused, rendered unusable and unsafe, polluted and dissipated, but the sheer necessity of it for life, human, animal and plant, requires us, in our different capacities as religious leaders, policy-makers and legislators, economic actors and businessmen, farmers etc., to jointly show responsibility and exercise care for our common home (#13).

"Fresh drinking water is an issue of primary importance, since it is indispensable for human life and for supporting terrestrial and aquatic ecosystems . . . 2.2 billion, or nearly one out of every three people on the planet, lack access to safely managed drinking water services, according to a 2019 report from UNICEF and the World Health Organization. Around 3 billion people also lack basic hand washing facilities, a problem that has been sharply felt during the COVID-19 pandemic. *Diocesan Pastoral Council*
