Fragments from my diary 09.01.22

"Why does God allow hunger... the presence of starving children in our world?" she asked. To be honest I've been waiting for this question. The years have passed and she's been growing into adulthood... her question suggests that she hasn't left faith behind... not yet!

I immediately thought of Pope Francis and his recent hugely controversial reference to choosing pets over children...

But I sensed she was asking a much bigger question... how could I possibly believe in the Christian God?

I asked her to imagine God answering her question about hunger by saying: "I created you!"

You are part of Heaven's answer I told her, each and every person according to our ability... according to how we use our talents to gain a return for the land owner... the land owner being the Creator. Matt 25:14

God created men and women capable of creating wealth... people capable of creating a very comfortable lifestyle, amassing thousands, hundreds of thousands, millions and billions... and all because they've got something we desire... or have they also created the desire?

The more capable and the more successful we are in the task of creating wealth the more God expects of us...

From the man who has been given much, much is expected. Luke 12:48

In fact, in the end this will be a significant part of our final judgement... how we used the wealth we created and for what purposes.

Thus Jesus constantly warned about the danger of riches - from which flows materialism - because materialism makes the ego avaricious... and in the end we can have so much in this life but so little in the next. Luke 16:19

This is the point Pope Francis is trying to make... unfortunately he chose to use our beloved pets as his illustration!

Make no mistake: We'll be judged on how we disposed of the wealth we created... whether we used it for my kingdom (which sometimes extends to our kingdom, me and my family) or God's Kingdom.

This is sore. Very sore.

We want God to sort poverty and starvation - sort just about everything - but God desires that we sort it because in sorting it we're making ourselves fit for the kingdom of God... capable of sharing his space!
