Fragments from the diary

Before ever talking about getting people to go to Mass we need to talk about getting people to go to Jesus!

Ponder the woman in last Sunday's Gospel - the woman caught in adultery. Imagine how she'll feel about Jesus... she'll adore him... she'll love him passionately... she'll defend him... in the end she might even die for him!

Yes, she might forget it all at times, but she'll always come back to it. It'll always be for her a transformative experience.

Our talk about getting people to go to Mass almost always misses this point.

If we're serious about getting people to go to Mass we must go back to a much earlier stage on the Christian spiritual journey, to a personal encounter with Jesus Christ.
