Wexford General Hospital is holding their Service of Remembrance at Clonard Church, Wexford on Friday 11th November 2022 at 7.00pm.

The Service of Remembrance is particularly intended for families

and friends of those who died at Wexford General Hospital over the past year or who have a strong connection with the hospital. However, the service is also open to anyone who wishes to attend.

The purpose of the service is to provide an opportunity to remember as a community, people we love who have died - to reminisce and celebrate their lives and all they meant to us. This event is open to peoples of all faiths and of none. Tea and coffee will be served afterwards.

The Service is organised on an annual basis by the Standing Committee for End of Life Care at Wexford General Hospital. This committee is comprised of staff from all areas of the hospital. Their work includes organising the Service of Remembrance, implementing initiatives such as the writing and sending out of sympathy cards, refurbishment of the mortuary and family rooms, providing written bereavement information for relatives and developing education programmes for staff.
