## Ash Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> February 2024 The Season of Lent

The season of Lent is a Catholic liturgical season consisting of forty days of fasting, prayer, and penitence beginning at Ash Wednesday and concluding at sundown on Holy Thursday. The official liturgical colour for the season of Lent is violet. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, begin new life in Christ.

Saint Valentine, the patron saint of love and beekeeping, was a Roman priest martyred in 270 AD for marrying couples against the wishes of the emperor who had banned the union to ensure more men to keep his military strong!

A feast day on February 14th was declared in his honour by the pope a few hundred years later.

In 1835, Irish Carmelite priest, Fr. John Spratt was invited to deliver sermons in Rome. The locals were so taken with his oratory that the pope gifted him several unconventional tokens of thanks including saintly relics. Upon Fr. Spratt's return to Dublin, he bestowed

these gifts to Our Lady of Mount Carmel on Whitefriars Street. Gifts including the preserved heart of Saint Valentine

Such relics hold sacred value for the faithful. And while a sacred heart might seem like a difficult thing to misplace, this relic was lost and was only rediscovered in the 1950s. The heart now sits in a place of prominence, securely locked in a golden box in the Church for those curious to visit. And to this day every February 14th, romantic couples visit the church to receive a special "blessing of the rings."
