Church Car Park Update

Hopefully the weather is getting better so we hope to be re-marking the church car park soon.

Obviously, it'll make the task easier if the car park is clear of cars while we're re-marking it. Ideally, the car park will need to be emptied and closed the night before. So, we're flagging it now - trying to get the word out - and as soon as we have a definite date we will place notices in the car park to inform all who avail of the car park that it'll be closed to facilitate re-marking.

New signage has been ordered for the disability parking spaces and should be up during the coming week and when the spaces are remarked and signed, the penalty for parking illegally in these spaces will be clamping.

We are currently receiving quotes for the electronic barrier which will be open (raised) to allow people to enter and exit the car park for religious events. Thereafter - outside the times of religious events - the barrier will be closed. However, when the barrier is
