Pentecost Sunday

The name of the day itself is derived from the Greek word "pentecoste," meaning 50th. Pentecost always occurs 50 days after the resurrection of Jesus and 10 days after his ascension into heaven. Because Easter is a moveable feast without a fixed date, and

Pentecost depends on the timing of Easter, Pentecost can fall anywhere between May 10 and June 13. In the Christian tradition, Pentecost is the celebration of the person of the Holy Spirit coming upon the Apostles, Mary, and the first followers of Jesus, who were gathered in the Upper Room. A "strong, driving" wind filled the room where they were gathered, and tongues of fire came to rest on their heads, allowing them to speak in different languages so that they could understand each other.

It was such a strange phenomenon that some people thought the Christians were just drunk — but Peter pointed out that it was only the morning, and said the phenomenon was caused by the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit also gave the apostles the other gifts and fruits necessary to fulfil the great commission — to go out and preach the Gospel to all nations. It fulfils the New Testament promise from Christ (Luke 24:46-49) that the Apostles would be "clothed with power" before they would be sent out to spread the Gospel. Jesus has promised us an Advocate - the Holy Spirit and on this Pentecost Day the Holy Spirit came to the Apostles as a great wind and fire. Today we rejoice that spirit is moving within our hearts to understand the mystery of our faith and strengthening us to follow Jesus the Anointed One.
